

## Summary Report of Tribal Voice Youth Arts

Tribal Voice Youth Arts are funded to develop a range of electoral awareness materials for use within their own project, primarily based in Kerowagi, Chimbu, but aired on national radio and for use across the country.

This summary is a report from their first part of the project: development of materials.

### **What they have done**

The group attended the ESP training program in Port Moresby, December last year as a first step in the project and have now begun to develop materials for use.

They have developed:

1. a Kerowagi election calendar with good voting messages on it, combined with photos from Kerowagi – signed off by ESP and finally by ICAD already
2. an information brochure for voters and candidates about the LPV system – signed off by ESP and finally by ICAD already
3. three radio plays; *Wanem em LPV?*; *Hao bai yu nominet? Hao bai mi vot?* – yet to be reviewed and signed off by ESP and ICAD. They are working on another three episodes; *Enromen*; *Ol meri I gat ol rait*; *Agita* (which looks at the risk of increasing HIV/AIDS infections at election time).

They have also gone home to Kerowagi to begin to set up their awareness visits to Kerowagi. They have discussed their program with John Elly and other funded groups in the area e.g. Meri I Kirap and the Chimbu police and they will join in to the police project when they go across Kerowago.
