2022 NATIONAL ELECTION

CODE OF CONDUCT









PURPOSE

Security for the elections will be provided by the Royal Papua New Guinea Constabulary, the Defence Force, and the Correctional Services. Collectively they are referred to as the **Joint Security Forces**









The Joint Security Forces are required to perform their tasks in accordance with their orders and the training given in; electoral laws, regulations, polling procedures and guidelines - as provided in Commission's General Order, 21 October 2021.

This guide is an aid for Joint Security Forces providing reminders on "Do" and "Do Not".



Through out the electoral period Joint Security Forces will:

- Wear uniform and carry ID when fulfilling their Duties
- Comply with their training and legal orders of their chain of command
- Exercise their duties in accordance with electoral laws, regulations and guidelines
- Maintain a safe voting environment for voters, polling staff, observers and scrutineers
- Provide security for election staff and materials during activity, movement and storage

Through out the electoral period Joint Security Forces will:

Respect the authority of the Presiding Officer as the person in charge of the election at the polling booth

Only enter Polling Booths to support the Presiding Officer when requested

Assist the Presiding Officer in removing and/or arresting those committing electoral and/or public order offenses

Report incidents and escalate critical events to your chain of command

Refrain from any inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment

Ensure voters are able to exercise their democratic rights

Through out the electoral period Joint Security Forces WILL NOT:

- Take over any election duty assigned to the Polling Booth Team
- Enter a Polling Booth **unless**
 - Invited/requested/ordered to do so by the Presiding Officer
 - Requested to provide support to assist a voter
- Discriminate against any voter based on; race, ethnicity, language, gender, religion, political outlook, social background, age, or economic status.
- Facilitate unequal or discriminatory enforcement of the law

Through out the electoral period Joint Security Forces WILL NOT:

- Ask for any additional; payment, fiscal support, food or drink
- Use excessive force
- Express a political opinion
- Communicate with; Press, Party Agents, Observers, unless authorised
- Use investigatory powers as a tool for intimidation
- Carry out arbitrary arrests or detentions
